"Our office is right down the block from the restaurant and many of our employees and clients have noticed a big change in the food," continues *Santore*.

McGillicuddy's takes over where the Lakehouse left off as a local haven for residents of Interlaken, Loch Arbour, Allenhurst, West Allenhurst, Ocean Township and Deal. Many of these area residents frequent the restaurant more than one night a week. In the summertime, the outside deck is packed with three generations of families from this local following. Grandparents, parents and their college-aged children all frequent the restaurant, especially during the summer.
